Frequency and Circulation

The Tecumseh Herald publishes weekly on Thursday with a circulation of 3,600 delivered in the mail as well as 27 newsstands in Tecumseh, Britton, Adrian and the Irish Hills.

Paper Size and Format

The Thursday edition is a broadsheet format measuring 12.5" x 23" (print area 11.62" x 20.5") with six columns per page.

Advertising Rates and Discounts

Display advertising rate is \$11.15 per column inch. Design is included free of charge. Frequency and quantity contract discounts are available.

Display Advertising and Deadlines

The deadline for the Thursday edition is Monday at 5 p.m. Attempts to accommodate late advertising past deadlines will be made but cannot be guaranteed.

Classified Rates and Deadlines

Priced by the number of words. The same classified ad with no changes in copy can run for three weeks for the price of two weeks. Classified prices include publication in Thursday print editions as well as online. Deadline is Tuesday at noon for the Thursday edition.

Inserts and Deadlines

Insert rates are full circulation - \$285; subscribers only - \$170; and newsstand only - \$140. Deadlines are Tuesdays at noon for the Thursday edition.

Billing

Terms: Net 30 days
VISA, MasterCard, Discover and American Express accepted.

Proofs will be provided to advertisers who require them. It is the advertiser's responsibility to review ad proofs immediately for accuracy. The Tecumseh Herald is not responsible for errors not caught by an advertiser. All advertising corrections or changes must be reported to the Herald by 9 a.m. on Wednesday. Advertisers who submit copy after the space reservation deadline risk not seeing a proof. Changes, other than corrections of typographical errors, will be made only if publication schedule allows.
